
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
SLAVERY AND TRANS-ATLANTIC SLAVE TRADE

- I will talk about how all they were taken away because of the invasion of the Europeans




ANCIENT EGYPT

- Trading was easy too as they were able to use the Nile and Niger river to travel around










- This shows the irrigation system and how the society worked together
- How the Nile helped with trading, agriculture, building




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
- The architecture work done by the Ancient Egyptians
- Society working as a whole in one kingdom




M A L I E M P I R E

- Mansa Musa on the throne and how his people eating well




THE GREAT ZIMBABWE


- who was also known as the "House of Rocks"

CONT. THE GREAT ZIMBABWE








- Stone Houses that they built

- Trading route with the East side with Asia




- The Europeans wanted to trade with the people of Africa as it was an easier access to trade with the other side.

TRANS-ATLANTIC SLAVE TRADE




- These picture shows the cruel journey they went through while being transported to the New World.

- They are sold like an action and people examine them to see who is best fit for them


HOW THEY WERE SOLD



SLAVES WORKING










- Force labor and living condition was bad

- Some people did both which was sad




- Nate Turner revolt in Virginia

- It was not over as some free slaves went back to their slave owner for job as they could not find any
- Others found a place to work together and build and community
- Free slaves who went back to Africa did not feel welcome because they lost their identity
- The languages, foods, cultures, traditions, and more was different to them as they did not know
